Winsten Mathematics Scholarships

Terms and conditions applicable to 2010 entry

These terms and conditions apply to Winsten Mathematics Scholarships awarded to students entering the University of Essex in October 2010. Nothing stated here applies to any other year of entry.

0. To qualify for the Winsten Scholarship(s), the student must enrol on a single honours Mathematics course at undergraduate level (G100, G102 or G190) at the University of Essex, in October 2010.
1. The Department will pay a maximum of £1,000 to any one student.
2. For each problem the first ten correct solutions received will qualify for the scholarship.
3. The Department will publish on their website the current number of correct answers received.
4. Solutions must be complete, which is to say that students must prove that their answer is correct.
5. The Department reserves the right to interview applicants concerning their solutions.
6. Students who submit a correct solution will receive acknowledgement that it is correct, and will be advised of the current size of the potential scholarship for which they have qualified.
7. Payments will be made at the beginning of December 2010, by cheque or by other means, at a date chosen by the Department.
8. This payment will be in addition to any other scholarships or bursaries for which the student may qualify.
9. Solutions should be sent to Mathematics Challenge, Department of Mathematical Sciences, University of Essex, Wivenhoe Park, Colchester, Essex, CO4 3SQ
10. Closing date for 2010 entry is Wednesday 31st March 2010.
11. The names of all potential scholarship winners will be posted on our website by Friday 16 April 2010.
12. Acceptance of the scholarship constitutes acceptance of these terms and conditions.
13. Transferability: Change of course will not affect award of the scholarship, providing that the student continues to be registered on an eligible course as defined above.
14. Resolution of disputes: In cases not covered by the terms and conditions above, the Head of Department or his nominee will decide on any variations to these terms and conditions, and his decision will be final.
