## **Health and Care Professions (H&CP) Practice Education Guidance (2016)**

The Health and Care Professions (H&CP) Education Leads Group, in collaboration with the National Association of Educators in Practice (NAEP) and the Council of Deans of Health (CoDH) developed a statement about practice education to which the CSP contributed and committed support to.

The purpose of the statement and its associated guidance is to foster a culture whereby all learners experience an inclusive, learning-centred, empowering and level appropriate learning experience in practice.

It advises practice educators should:

- take responsibility for acquiring and developing the knowledge, skills and behaviours required to facilitate and support the learning of others.
- undertake initial practice educator preparation and training, facilitated by the education provider relevant to the profession.
- engage in on-going continuing professional development (CPD) related to practice education.

In line with the CSP Practice Based-Learning Principles (2022) team approach, and Health and Care Professions Standards for Education (2017) 5.6: Ensuring practice educators have relevant knowledge, skills and experience to support safe and effective learning, the University of Essex Physiotherapy programmes are facilitating the following, free to access, opportunities for our practice partners:

1. Asynchronous, virtual practice educator induction: Nuts and Bolts.
2. Synchronous, virtual, Nuts and Bolts associated discussion forum
3. In-person workshops

## Practice Educator induction: Nuts and Bolts

Online, asynchronous induction hosted on OpenEssex. 'Nuts and Bolts' has been revised for 22-23.

Comprising 6 sections of information, designed to be explored as a complete package for individuals new to UoE Physiotherapy placements. Or as individual sections of information 'refreshers' for individuals who may not have facilitated a placement for a while.

Sections are available all year around and can be explored over a period of time.

The aim is to familiarise practice educators with the processes and procedures they need to understand in order to facilitate a successful placement for a UoE Physiotherapy student.

Completion of all six sections, and a short quiz, will generate a downloadable certificate of completion.

Nuts and Bolts is ideal for therapists new to practice education, or those returning to practice education after a break.

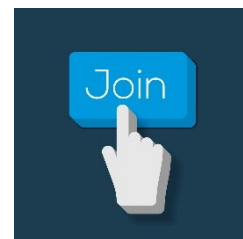
### Discussion forums

Commencing in October, to support Nuts and Bolts, a member of the UoE physio academic will host a live, virtual practice education Q&A/discussion forum every other month.

Forums are advertised via local practice education leads; education departments and anyone completing the Nuts and Bolts units in the past 6 months will be invited directly.

All practice educators who have recently, or about to, support a student on placement are welcome to join to ask questions and discuss anything related to organising and facilitating a placement. Sessions will be hosted on MSTeams.

## **In person workshops**
