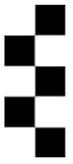

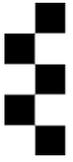

**Expected outcomes:**

- Completed and submitted final doctoral thesis in the range of 60-80,000 words or the agreed equivalent for PhD creative practice.
- Successfully passed viva voce examination.

**Further expected outcomes:**

- The ability to constructively defend research outcomes in viva voce examination and in academic fora such as seminars, conferences and publications
