

It must reflect ongoing research.</i></p>	<p>Research Project Proposal (6000 words), including (dependent on subject area):</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Write central research problem/questions to be answered. ▪ Identify preliminary argument. ▪ Methodological considerations – explain rationale for selecting primary sources; consider strengths and limitations of primary sources; identify approaches or analytical tools used by scholars for similar sources; specify methods informing analysis or might be needed. ▪ Feasibility Report – identify primary sources (and their location), access to sources, travel required, and ethical considerations. ▪ Create project plan, outlining objectives for each stage.
