### **Back from Africa**

Welcome back to Dominic Taddei who has returned to his role as a patrol officer after a two-year career break undertaking charity work in east Africa.

Dominic said: "I had travelled a fair bit to remote areas of the world and it made me realise just how lucky we have it here in the UK. I wanted to help others less fortunate and experience their living conditions to better understand what life is like for them.

"I initially worked in Ethiopia, teaching in

a school for three months. For the rest of my time in Africa I was working with Roll Out The Barrel Trust UK.

"I was mostly dealing with providing clean water through the use of filters and the issue of carrying water using the charity's rotary barrel system. I also tackled the issue of period poverty, helped renovate a school and build new toilets."

Dominic's work will be remembered long after his return home. "One of my most touching experiences was while I was giving mosquito nets to a traditional birth attendant. She was caring for a woman in labour who, immediately after giving birth, asked me to come through to see her. She asked my name to which I replied, Dominic. She said that's a nice name and I will I call my son that, thank you for providing the mosquito nets." "My time in Africa was an amazing experience and an eye opener to see how people really live. I lived in the slums, ate and drank the same food and water, lived in mud huts and travelled sitting on the top of trucks I experienced Africa's biggest slum Kibera, two violent elections in Kenya and drought in Ethiopia. Encountering such living conditions made me really appreciate the small things in life."
