

Essex Futures Refugee Care Scholarship 2024-25

The Department of Psychosocial and Psychoanalytic Studies is offering a £10,000 scholarship to assist postgraduate students taking the full time on campus or online MA Refugee Care course within the department.

We have been extremely fortunate to offer this award due to the kind donation from a donor who wishes to support students through their studies in MA Refugee Care.

This scholarship will be awarded in the academic year 2024-25 and the application process is competitive.

The following document outlines the full terms and conditions of this scholarship. Please ensure you read them in full before you complete and submit an application form.

Terms and conditions

Eligibility

- Applicants must have received a conditional or unconditional offer to study full time MA Refugee Care (on campus or online) within the Department of Psychosocial and Psychoanalytic Studies, at the University of Essex starting in academic year 2024-25.
- These scholarships are available to students who are home and overseas fee payers and are entirely self-funded*.
- Applicants must have achieved a 2:1, or higher, in their undergraduate degree.
- The award cannot be held in conjunction with any other University of Essex scholarships.
- Successful applicants should be available for promotional activities.

*Students receiving a repayable loan to fund their studies will be considered as self-funded.

Students who are not eligible

The following students are NOT eligible for this scholarship regardless of meeting the above criteria:

- This scholarship award does not apply to deferred entry. Where a scholarship has been awarded to a student who subsequently defers entry to the following academic year, the award will be withdrawn, and the applicant will be considered again in line with the terms and conditions that apply in the new proposed year of entry.
- The scholarship cannot be continued for students repeating periods of study in any circumstances.

How to apply

You can apply for the award by completing an application form and submitting it to ppsdm@essex.ac.uk. The deadline to apply for this fund is Friday 31 May 2024 at midnight (GMT).

Selection process

Selection will be based on your eligibility and the information and supporting statements that you provide as part of the application process.

An initial review will take place to ensure applications meet the criteria listed. All applications that meet the criteria will be passed to a panel within the Department of Psychosocial and Psychoanalytic Studies.

As part of your scholarship application, you will be required to submit the following:

- A 300-word statement about why the scholarship would be beneficial to you in helping you achieve your ambitions for the future.

Notification

You will be notified of the award via email to the email account that you included on your application. You will receive your outcome by the end of June 2024.

You must accept your offer of the scholarship **within two weeks** of an offer being made, otherwise the offer will be forfeited and awarded to next eligible candidate.

Payment arrangements

- These scholarships will only be made available as a reduction on the tuition fee that is payable on registration at the University. For students who are overseas fee payers, your tuition fees will be reduced to the home fee rate and covered by the scholarship.
- If you intermit from your course, you may, at the discretion of the University, be entitled to a pro-rata payment of the remainder of your award on your return to study. Please contact the [Funding](#)
