Ineligible Programmes

Students receiving US Federal Aid are governed by stringent US Department of Education regulations. Only campus based students studying on a full time or at least half time basis are eligible to apply. The following programmes are not eligible:

- Nursing and medicine courses (including the MD programme)
- Joint qualifications and dual awards with French Law Schools
- Courses with any period of study abroad where the period of study abroad equates to more than 25% of the entire course.
- Non-degree programmes (e.g. certificate, diploma or English language programmes)
- Programmes studied less than 'half-time' (part-time)
- Any programmes delivered by distance learning
- Any programmes delivered (wholly or by joint study) at one of our partner institutions

Students on ineligible courses can apply for a private loan to fund the full cost of their course via a private loan provider, such as <u>Sallie Mae</u>.

Courses that are taught or part taught with another institution that is not eligible or not certified to participate in the William D Ford Direct Loans (Direct Loan) programme - Worldwide eligible institutions
