

Masters EU Scholarship 2027-28

This scholarship is for EU postgraduate taught (Masters) students, studying as new students in academic year 2027-28, who are classified as Overseas students for fees purposes. The awards offered are a discount of up to £5,000 automatically deducted from your tuition fees. Details of the awards available under this scheme are below:

Department	Scholarship Award
ALL	Full-time study: £5,000
ALL	Part-time study: £2,500 in year 1 £2,500 in year 2

Terms and conditions

Eligibility

- These scholarships are restricted to students who are Overseas fee payers and are entirely self-funded*.
- Students must be ordinarily resident (see below for the definition of ordinary residence) in an EU country.
- Students studying distance learning courses, delivered wholly by the University of Essex, are eligible.
- Students must register at the University of Essex in October 2027 or January 2028 for the first year of a full-time or part time Masters course in academic year 2027-28 only, leading to the degree of:
 - MA, MSc, LLM, MFA, MPP, MBM, MRes
- The award may be held in conjunction with the Early Bird Discount and cannot be held in conjunction with any other University of Essex scholarships. Students who are eligible for this

award and are joining Essex through a link agreement, which includes a discounted fee, will receive the award which is greater in value.

- This discount is available for the first year of full-time study or the first two years of part-time study starting in 2027-28 only.
- Successful students should be available for promotional activities.

*Students receiving a repayable loan to fund their studies will be considered as self-funded.

Students who are not eligible

The following students are NOT eligible for the Masters EU Scholarship regardless of meeting the above criteria:

- Students studying University of Essex Online courses, delivered in partnership with Kaplan Open Learning.
- Students who are not ordinarily resident in an EU country.
- Students who are receiving full or partial financial sponsorship from their government or other external agency, on a non-repayable basis.
- Students undertaking the Essex MBA, for which we offer a separate scholarship.
- Students awarded the scholarship who defer entry to following academic years will not be automatically eligible to receive the award and will be considered in line with the terms and conditions that apply in the new proposed year of entry.
- Students who are transferring to Essex under a formal, progression link or dual degree arrangement with a link institution abroad, for whom other discounting arrangements apply, or are eligible for a Global Partner Scholarship.
- Students who are assessed as paying Home tuition fees.
- Current students whose first year of Postgraduate study at the University of Essex, was prior to academic year 2027-28.

What is “Ordinary Residence”?

For the purposes of assessing eligibility for the scholarship, you must have been ordinarily resident in an EU country, for the three-year period prior to commencing your course. Ordinarily resident means that you must have been habitually, normally and lawfully, residing in the EU, from choice, for the specified period. The three-year period for courses starting in October 2027 is calculated as 1 September 2024 to 1 September 2027. Temporary absences during this three-year period may be permitted at the discretion of the relevant University officer. Students may be asked to provide documentary evidence to determine ordinary residence and an assessment of whether a student meets

the ordinary residence criteria will normally be made by the Head of Admissions or their nominee, and their decision will be final.

How to apply

If you meet all the eligibility criteria, you will automatically be considered for this award. You don't need to complete an application form. The University will assess your eligibility based on your country of domicile and fee status that you submit on your application for your place at Essex.

Payment arrangements

These scholarships will only be made available as a reduction on the tuition fee that is payable on registration at the University. Payment cannot be offset against a tuition fee deposit if one is required. If you intermit from your course, you may, at the discretion of the University, be entitled to a pro-rata payment of the remainder of your award on your return to study. Resolution of disputes

Acceptance of this award constitutes acceptance of these terms and conditions. Applicants should contact the [Postgraduate Admissions Team](#) in the first instance for guidance regarding this award. Registered students should contact the [Funding Team](#). In cases not covered by the above terms and conditions, or where a student claims exceptional circumstances, or disputes a decision not to make payments due under an award, final appeals on decisions regarding eligibility must be made via the [Student Complaints process](#). The Academic Registrar or their nominee will review the case and his/her decision will be final.
