University of Essex Research Data Management Policy Route Map

Background

This route map identifies in general terms the areas of work that need to be undertaken to enable and facilitate implementation of the University's Research Data Management Policy.

The route map allocates responsibilities and timescales for each area. It does not attempt to define or set out the practicalities of how each work area will be achieved.

Both the Policy and the Route Map have been developed as part of the Essex Research Data Repository (Essex-RDR), which is a JISC-funded project led by the UK Data Archive (UKDA) and involves the UKDA working in collaboration with two Professional Services Sections, Information Systems Services (ISS) and the Research and Enterprise Office (REO). This project, which focuses on development of a pilot research data management infrastructure, is due for completion at the end of March 2013, but the work on data management will be ongoing. This work support good practice to which current practice should be aligned.
