Entry requirements for Norwegian students

Undergraduate

- Vitnemål overall average of 4.0 from six best subjects. Vitnemål English 4 OR IELTS 6.0, TOEFL IBT 76
- We also accept the IB Diploma (standard requirement 30 points)

Postgraduate

- Minimum requirement: D in undergraduate degree. Vitnemål English 4 or IELTS 6.0-7.5, TOEFL IBT 76-100
