

Proving your Right to Study in the UK for Summer Schools

Required Documents

It is your responsibility to provide documentation that proves you have the right to study in the UK, failure to do so may mean you are unable to start or continue your study.

UK or Irish nationals

Identity Documents Required	UK Immigration documents required (all documents must be originals unless specified)
<p>British, UK or Irish Citizen passport or Irish passport card or;</p> <p>If you were born inside the UK/Ireland and are a British national but don't have a British, UK or Irish passport, we will require two documents from the following list:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Birth or adoption certificate issued in the UK, Channel Islands, Isle of Man or Ireland including name of parent(s)• Current UK driving licence• Student Loans Company tuition fee loan confirmation (electronic/good quality paper copy accepted)• Disclosure and Barring Service Certificate*• Benefits paperwork issued by HMRC, Job Centre Plus or a UK local authority* *dated within the last 3 months <p>If you are a British or Irish national but were not born in the UK or Ireland, you must provide your British Citizen, UK or Irish passport. No alternative documents can be accepted.</p>	<p>No additional documents required unless you were born outside the UK/Ireland, in which case you'll need to provide a British/Irish passport or proof of your British Citizenship.</p> <p>Note: If you have a British National Overseas (BNO); British Overseas Territories Citizen or British Overseas Citizen passport you'll need a visa or other immigration status documents, read the section for those from outside the UK/Ireland.</p> <p>If you have Indefinite leave or settlement and have not been granted British Citizenship, we will require evidence of your UK immigration status, please see the relevant section below.</p>

I'm from outside the UK/Ireland

Your UK Immigration Status	Documents required (all documents must be originals unless specified)
Visitor	<p>Valid passport and,</p> <p>If you applied overseas: Visitor entry clearance (EC) vignette (sticker in your passport) which has been stamped by a Border official when you entered the UK.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> If your entry clearance vignette was not stamped by a Border Official, you must provide evidence of the date you arrived in the UK. This should ideally have your name and the date that you arrived in the UK on it e.g., travel ticket/boarding pass. <p>If you were granted entry at the UK Border:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Visitor date stamp in your passport or: You must provide evidence of the date you arrived in the UK. This should ideally have your name and the date that you arrived in the UK on it e.g., travel ticket/boarding pass. <p><i>Note: date of entry must be no more than 6 months before the end date of your course.</i></p>
Student	<p>Valid passport and,</p> <p>Share code - You'll need to provide us with a share code that you can obtain via the government website: https://www.gov.uk/view-prove-immigration-status. We need this to check your eVisa. <i>Please note: we cannot accept the right to work or right to rent share code.</i></p> <p>If you applied for your Student leave from outside the UK, you must also provide:</p> <p>EEA nationals – You must provide evidence of the date you arrived in the UK. This should ideally have your name and the date that you arrived in the UK on it e.g., travel ticket/boarding pass.</p> <p>Other nationals - entry clearance (EC) vignette (sticker in your passport) which has been stamped by a Border official when you entered the UK.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> If your entry clearance vignette was not stamped by a Border Official, you must provide evidence of the date you arrived in the UK. We need this to check your eVisa. <i>Please note: we cannot accept the right to work or right to rent share code.</i> Or • a letter from the Home Office confirming the grant of your leave
<p>Ukrainian Scheme</p>	<p>Passport and,</p> <p>Share code - You'll need to provide us with a share code that you can obtain via the government website: https://www.gov.uk/view-prove-immigration-status. We need this to check your eVisa. <i>Please note: we cannot accept the right to work or right to rent share code.</i></p>

<p>British National Overseas or; British Overseas Territories Citizen or; British Overseas Citizen with a Certificate of Entitlement</p>	<p>Valid passport and,</p> <p>Check the Home Office website to see if you need UK immigration permission to study with us. If your parents were born in the UK, you may automatically be a British citizen or be entitled to apply but we'll need to see a valid document to prove your immigration status.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Certificate of Entitlement to study in the UK • If you have another type of immigration permission, see the relevant category in this table.
<p>Other</p>	<p>Valid passport and,</p> <p>Share code - You'll need to provide us with a share code that you can obtain via the government website: https://www.gov.uk/view-prove-immigration-status.
