English qualifications or tests taken over five years ago:

TOEFL:

All TOEFL tests must be verifiable online by the University at the point that any offer is made. Verification is only available online within 2 years of the date of the test.

Approved test centres and dates:

All of the tests specified below are acceptable and, for study at degree-level, these tests can be taken at any test centre, not just approved UKVI test centres. For courses below degree-level (currently Certificate of Higher Education in Theatre Arts), please see additional requirements specified in the table below relating to approved test centres and the date your test was taken, in line with changes to Home Office requirements published in April 2015.  Requirements for Nursing, Social Work, Journalism, Physiotherapy, Occupational Therapy and Speech and Language Therapy: Please note that there are different IELTS requirements for entry to the following courses:

- BSc Nursing (Adult) and BSc Nursing (Mental Health) 7.0 overall with 6.5 in writing, and 7.0 in all other components.
- BA Multimedia Journalism 7.0 overall with a minimum of 5.5 in each component.
- BA Social Work, BSc Physiotherapy and BSc Occupational Therapy 7.0 overall with a minimum of 6.5 in each component.

• BSc Speech and Language Therapy – 8.0 overall with a minimum of 7.5 in each component.
