## Acceptance Speech by Honorary Graduate Karen Pickering

I'd get up and put my swim suit on and go to the pool and train and then have to go straight to school and nine times out of ten I used to forget to pack my underwear so I went through school with the nickname 'no knickers Pickers'! If you can get through that, you can get through anything!

So it is hard work and I don't need to tell you guys about hard work, you know, you wouldn't be here today if you hadn't put in the work and put in the effort.
