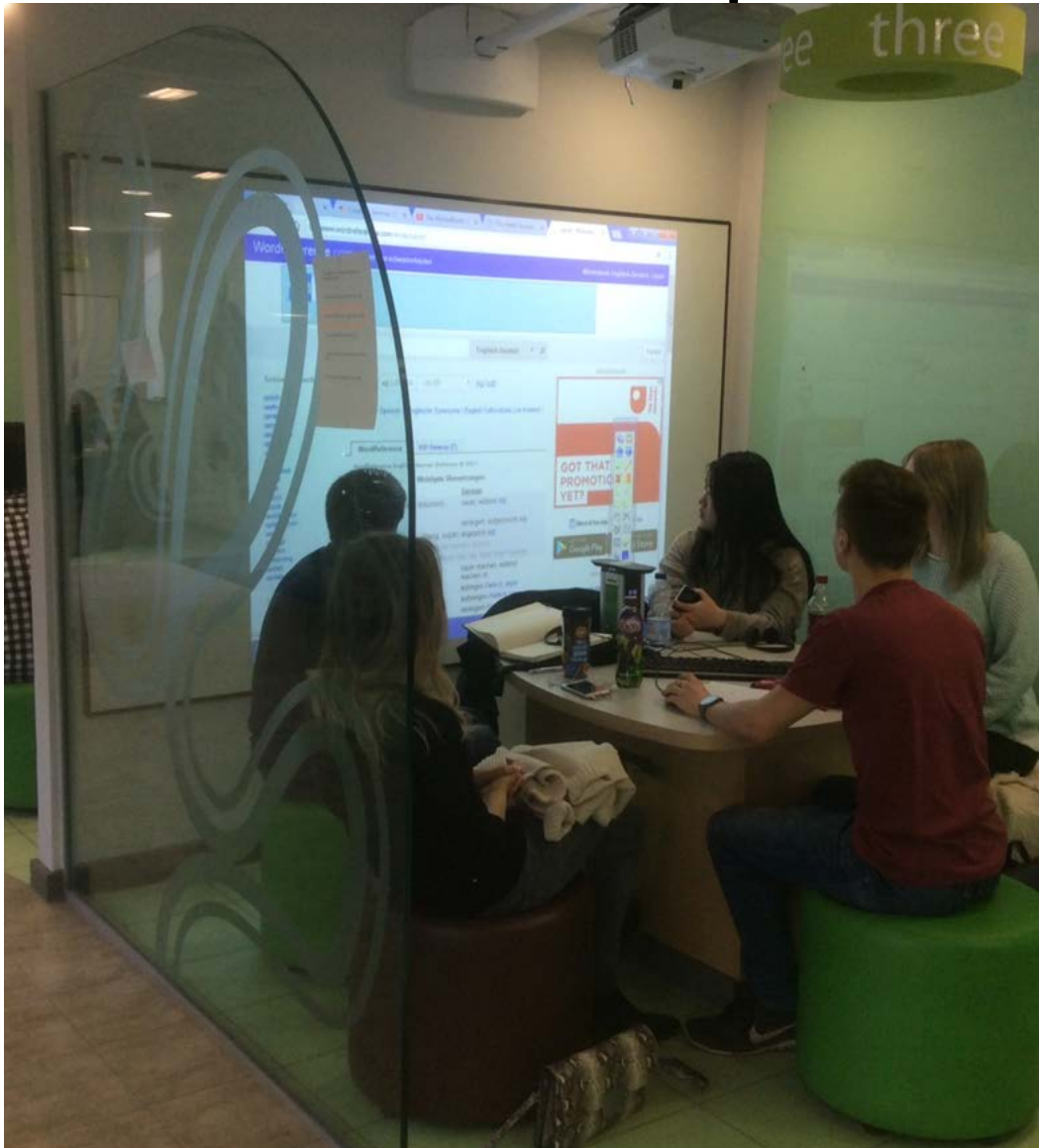

The teaching set-up

The Flipped Classroom

“...is a pedagogical model in which the typical lecture and homework elements of a course are reversed. Short video lectures are viewed by students at home before the class session, while in-class time is devoted to exercises, projects, or discussions. The video lecture is often seen as the key ingredient in the flipped approach, such lectures being either created by the instructor and posted online or selected from an online repository.”

HISTORY OF GERMAN NEWSPAPERS

The first German newspaper was *Relation aller Fürnemmen und gedenckwürdigen Historien* (Account of all distinguished and memorable news), published by printer **Johann Carolus** in Strasbourg in **1605**.

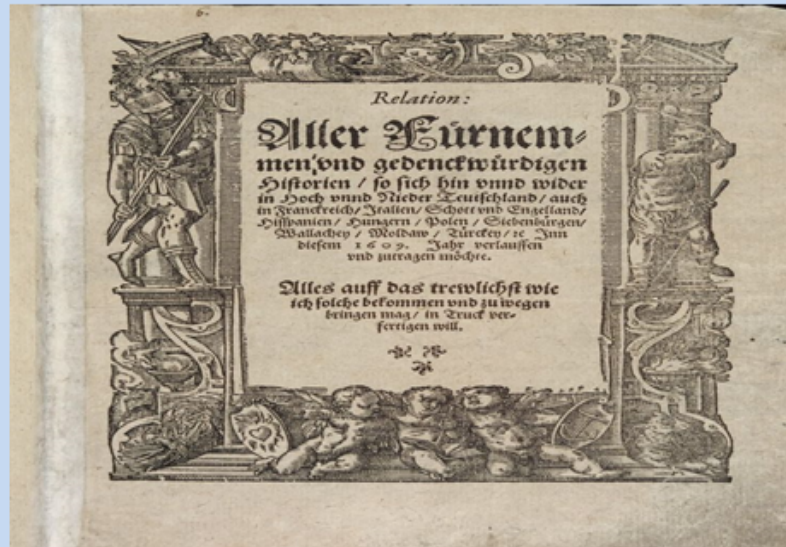


Bild was founded in 1952, and is based in Hamburg. It is classed as a tabloid, and uses large photos to illustrate its headlines.

Zeitung

- allgemeine Information
- allgemeine Öffentlichkeit
- täglich oder wöchentlich publiziert
- niedrige Qualität vom Papier und Druck
- Das Ziel: die Leute informieren
- es konzentriert sich auf allgemeine aktuelle Nachrichtenberichterstattung

- in verschiedenen Themen spezialisiert: *Mode, Celebrities, Musik, Auto und so weiter...*
- spezifische Öffentlichkeit
- Wöchentlich oder monatlich publiziert
- hohe Qualität vom Papier und Druck
- das Ziel: unterhalten, erziehen

die Öffentlichkeit, - = public, n.

die Nachrichtenberichterstattung, -en = news coverage, n.

Vokabular

Der Druck, -e = print, n.

allgemein = general, adj.

das Ziel, -e = goal, n.

verschieden = different, adj.
