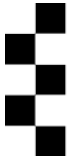

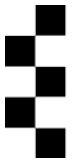

	<p>D: Demonstrate the ability to produce work of the quality and quantity in order to complete an MPhil within the three year maximum period.</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Evidence that academic writing is of standard and ability expected at MPhil level, including adequate referencing and language skills. <p>This will standardly take the form of a 10000-word document in good draft.</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ By end of year 1 SB and RSPC –(Term 3) for full-time students; ▪ By end of year 2 SB and RSPC – (Term 6) for part-time students.

M3: Completion Year (if needed)	A: Clear evidence of progress towards submission	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Completed final draft of thesis for Supervisor(s)/ Supervisory Panel comment 	By interim Supervisory Panel prior to submission/Term 2 of completion year (Term 8/9 for full-time students; Term 17/18 for part-time students).
