- Completed and submitted final doctoral thesis in the range of 60-80,000 words for a wholly critical dissertation; OR the agreed equivalent for PhD including creative practice (normally the creative work plus critical accompaniment of max 40, 000 words at Ph.D.)
- Successfully passed viva voce examination.

## Further expected outcomes:

- The ability to constructively defend research outcomes in viva voce examination and in academic fora such as seminars, conferences and publications
- The development and maintenance of co-operative networks and working relationships with supervisors, colleagues and peers within the institution and the wider research community.
- The ability to understand the processes for research funding and evaluation of research in the UK and globally.
- The ability to set realistic and achievable career goals, and identifying and developing ways to improve employability
