University of Essex GREAT Scholarships for Justice and Law 2022-23

China

The GREAT Scholarships for Justice and Law programme is a new joint initiative by the British Council and the Ministry of Justice, designed to attract some of the brightest postgraduates from around the world to study at UK universities in Justice and Law related subjects.

In partnership with the British Council and the GREAT Britain Campaign, the University of Essex is proud to be able to offer one (1) University of Essex GREAT Scholarship for Justice and Law 2022 for applicants from China. There is one scholarship available.

The University of Essex-GREAT Scholarships 2022 are valued at £10,000, which must be used towards the cost of tuition fees for a one-year taught Master's (MA, or LLM) degree in any Justice and Law discipline offered at the University of Essex; which are listed below:

- LLM Corporate Responsibility
- LLM Economics, Social and Cultural Rights
- LLM International Commercial and Business Law
- LLM International Human Rights Law
- LLM International Human Rights Law (Economic Relations)
- LLM International Law
- LLM International Trade Law
- LLM Maritime Law
- MA Human Rights and Cultural Diversity
- MA Theory and Practice of Human Rights.

In addition to the normal criteria for admission to the chosen University of Essex Master's degree, a GREAT Scholar must be:

- active in the field with work experience or with a proven interest in the proposed subject area
- able to demonstrate their motivation and academically be able to follow and benefit from an Essex postgraduate taught course
- willing to embody the UK Higher Education experience, by attending lectures and tutorials and engaging with extra-curricular activities, and act as an ambassador for UK Higher Education, by promoting the value of studying at a UK HEI
- Willing to act as a spokesperson in the justice and law space
- Willing to establish an engagement with the UK as a scholar, through personal and academic fulfilment
- Willing to attend justice and law related events in the UK upon invitation from the British Council
- Willing to demonstrate future contribution to capacity-building and socioeconomic advancement in the justice and law space through the benefits achieved after graduating from UK higher education
- As an alumnus of the UK, be willing occasionally to speak to potential candidates about his or her own experience of studying in the UK.

Terms and conditions

Eligibility

- You must hold a passport from an eligible country (China)
- Be classed as an overseas student for fee purposes
- Hold an offer (conditional or unconditional) to start a one year full time masters degree on the provided subject list starting in October 2022.
- Have a background of extracurricular activities relating to your chosen subject area and a evidenced interest in combatting climate change
- Only one scholarship award can be made per student and the award cannot normally be held in conjunction with other University of Essex awards.

Students who are not eligible

The following students are NOT eligible for this scholarship regardless of meeting the above criteria:

- Students undertaking courses at East 15 Acting School or non justice and law related courses.
- Students who are fully or partly sponsored
- These scholarship awards do not apply to deferred entry. Where a scholarship has been awarded to a student who subsequently defers entry to the following academic year, the award will be withdrawn and the applicant will be considered again in line with the terms and conditions that apply in the new proposed year of entry.
- Students who are not assessed as paying overseas fees.

Application questions

There are three questions which you will need to complete. The maximum word count for each question is 200 words. The questions are:

1 We are looking to support the brightest and best individuals who will actively contribute to the development of their home nation in the future. Please describe any special attributes or accomplishments that you think make you deserving of a University of Essex GREAT Scholarship for Justice and Law 2022?

This could be any academic or extra-curricular achievements, as well as your reasons for applying to the scholarship programme and why you want to study a subject related to justice and law.

We are looking for scholars who will be great ambassadors for the University of Essex. Please give an example of when you have recently contributed to your community

This could be your School or University, where you live, or any other community you feel a part of.

We would like to support students who have clear goals for their future. Please explain how studying your chosen programme at the University of Essex will help you to shape your plans after graduation?

Explain what has attracted you to study at the University of Essex, as well as outlining your ultimate career goals.

Payment arrangements

- These scholarships will only be made available as a reduction on the tuition fee that
 is payable on registration at the University. Payment cannot be offset against a tuition
 fee deposit if one is required.
- If you intermit from your course, you may, at the discretion of the University, be entitled to a pro-rata payment of the remainder of your award on your return to study. Please contact the Funding Team for further information.
